She earned her Master's degree in Ecology and Systematics from the Department of Biology, Biotechnical Faculty, University of Ljubljana, in 2007, and completed an interdisciplinary doctoral programme in Environmental Protection at the Faculty of Medicine, University of Ljubljana, in 2016. From 2016 to 2020, she served as Head of the Centre for Lifelong Learning at the Faculty of Health Sciences, University of Ljubljana.

Pedagogical work: Assistant in the field of sanitary engineering at several subjects in the Sanitary Engineering study programme, and she is a Senior Lecturer and course holder for Ergonomics in the Occupational Therapy study programme.
